PRESS RELEASE: IVRPD and Gauchos for Recovery Generate Generation Recovery, Pursue Harm Reduction

Isla Vista, CA – Isla Vista Recreation & Park District (IVRPD) and UCSB Gauchos for Recovery are excited to spring into the second event of the Spring Concert Series: Generation Recovery, an art and music festival that promotes rehabilitation and harm reduction for those experiencing addiction and substance use disorders. The interludes between each band set will feature overdose prevention trainings and—for those who pick up a free Narcan and fentanyl overdose prevention kit—raffles for two \$25 gift cards from Inspiring Sobriety and one \$200 gift card from Doing It Sober.

Event partners from the Isla Vista Food Co-Op, IV Trading Post, KCSB, and Students for Reproductive Justice will also be tabling during the live concert on Saturday, offering information and resources for attendees. Guests are also encouraged to take a ride on the mechanical bull and participate in a guided plant-potting workshop.

Five bands will play during the day: Michael Seitz, Acacia, French Cinema, Lemon Generation, and The Bad Neighbors. IVRPD thanks the rest of its partners—the Isla Vista Food Co-op, Isla Vista Trading Post, Students for Reproductive Justice, and KCSB—as well, without whom this event would not be possible.

"Safety in our community is a top concern, especially with the increase of fentanyl deaths in Santa Barbara County," said Santa Barbara County District 2 Supervisor Laura Capps. "This is an emergency, and we need all the resources, education, and awareness to help save lives. Thank you, IVRPD, for providing this support."

"Spring is a time of new beginnings. The weather warms, the leaves return, and tomorrow is another day," said IVRPD General Manager Kimberly Kiefer. "IVRPD is grateful to Gauchos for Recovery and all our partners for helping students chart a new course, one where you are never alone."

"The goal of Generation Recovery is to bring people together to celebrate recovery, promote harm reduction and well-being in our community, and to honor those we have lost to overdose", said Angie Bryan of Gauchos for Recovery. We are also celebrating the 10 year anniversary of the GFR program! Our Overdose Prevention Team in GFR, especially Phoebe Alva, have done an amazing job putting together an event that we hope will provide an opportunity for healing in our community, especially given the recent tragedies."

"Two of our Strategic Priorities are Community Engagement and Community Advocacy," said Sadie McDade, Marketing Manager of the IV Food Co-Op. We always love partnering with IVRPD on their events because it allows us to create

opportunities for the greater community to participate in the cooperative, and for our co-op to participate in the greater community."

"All of us at Isla Vista Trading Post are ecstatic to collaborate with the IV community for this event!," said Marlena and Lena of IV Trading Post. "Community safety and education are some of our core tenets as an organization and we are very much looking forward to showing our support this weekend. We can't wait to do all these while promoting and encouraging sustainability in our local community this Saturday from 1-4."

IVRPD Spring Concert Series: April 22 – May 13, 2023

What is the IVRPD Spring Concert Series?

It is a free, outdoor live music event hosted and presented by IVRPD in creative partnership with various student organizations from UCSB and Isla Vista. The Spring Concert Series is a month-long event featuring support from event sponsors and partner organizations.

When is the event?

The Spring Concert Series runs each Saturday from April 22nd through May 13, 2023. The Spring Concert Series is part of IVRPD's continuum of seasonal recreational programming and is one of IVRPPD's most popular premier live programming events.

What kind of activities will there be?

At this year's Spring Concert Series, a variety of activities will be offered, including tee-shirt tie dying, bracelet making, mechanical bull riding, plant-potting workshops, and much more!

Who can attend the event?

The Spring Concert Series is open to all ages. Everyone is welcome!

Where is the entrance to event?

The event entry point is located at Anisq'Oyo' Park at 950 Embarcadero Del Mar near Isla Vista Market.

What time does the event start?

The Spring Concert Series event starts each Saturday from 1pm-5pm. The grand finale will take place on Saturday May 13 from 1-9pm as the "Concert for the Coast" celebration and event wrap-up.

Will there be any food or water?

A limited supply of snacks and lite refreshments will be offered while supplies last.

What can I bring to the event?

Guests may bring lawn chairs, blankets, food, and drink. Drugs, alcohol and weapons are expressly forbidden. Please no smoking or vaping.
